2024 EPIPHANY CHALKING THE DOORS

Epiphany marks the occasion of a time-honored Christian tradition of "chalking the doors." The formula for the ritual for 2024 is simple. Take chalk of any color and write the following above the entrance of your home:

20 + C + M + B + 24

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi: Caspar, Melchior and Balthazar-who came to visit Jesus. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless this house." The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning and the "24" at the end mark the year.

Taken together, this inscription is a request for Christ to bless this home and that He stay with those who dwell herein Throughout the entire year. The chalking for the doors is a centuries-old practice throughout the world.
